- I. Katie Levene called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.
- II. Levene moved to approve the minutes from October 19, 2004. Eric Printz seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.
- III. Mayor Wysocki gave the board a brief update on the teen center.
- IV. The representative from the library talked about the Salute to our Soldiers program, where people of all ages have the opportunity to write a letter to the soldiers over seas. She also reminded everyone about teen poetry night.

The Hosea representative told the board that SAYES appreciated our help over the weekend with the leaves.
- V. Jack gave the board an update on the teen center and the architect meeting. Katie also explained about the architect in reference to the teen center and explained that things are looking promising.

- VI. Katie discussed with the board if we wanted new t-shirts. Everyone agreed that purchasing new shirts is a good idea. Board members are to bring t-shirt design ideas to the next meeting.
- VII. Katie thanked everyone who participated in the SAYES volunteer day on Saturday and Thursday. She said SAYES was hoping that we might have some other ideas for them to get teens evolved. Some suggestions included the schools' National Honors Societies (NHS), teen court, Boy Scouts, and sports teams.

- VIII. The food pantry needs help the day before mother's Day (2nd Saturday in May) with sorting the food that will come in. Most seemed interested when we took a vote of hands but we all decide later closer the time to commit.
- V. A brief over view of meeting with Park and Rec. about the problems with the frofling. Eric Printz said the ideas they had were to charge non-residents. Katie suggested they try and reorganize the course to eliminate problems. There will be more meetings about the frofl course in the future to form solutions to the problems currently occurring. All board members are invited to come and support the cause.

 - C. Dan talked about the frofling tournament. The idea of glow in the dark frofling was banned and the event will be held during in day. Their target date is sometime during the last weekend of school. Individuals will pay a higher entry fee than groups pay. Also, groups must RSVP before hand. Ordering t-shirts is a possibility. Scorekeepers will be needed to monitor each hole or with each group. They are also considering having a concessions stand and business sponsors. Kristi suggested pre-registration. Eric showed the signup sheet for the teams. Katie suggested contacting Park and Rec. and reserving a date.
 - D. Teddy S. talked about the Battle of the Bands meeting. Letters and posters will be sent to area schools to find bands. Katie designed these signs that will need to be posted by board members at both Eisenhower and West.
