### I. Brief New Member Welcome And Orientation

- A. Everybody present introduced themselves and explained their role on/in relation to the Youth Advisory Board.
- B. Greg Bybee explained the Board's structure to new members. The Board must decide how to restructure its committees.
- C. Bybee briefly explained Parliamentary Procedure (Robert's Rules Of Order) and distributed to each member a manual detailing this further. He emphasized that during each meeting, members *must* stick to the predetermined agenda.
- D. Anyone approved to be sworn in who has not yet done so must see the City Clerk as soon as possible.
- E. Complete New Member Welcome, Officer Speeches and Voting, Committee Forming, etc. will take place at the next meeting: July 15, 2003.

### II. Approval Of Minutes

- A. Bybee motioned to approved the minutes from May 21, 2003. Katie Chiovero seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.
- B. On May 28, 2003, a *committee* meeting concerning the Battle of the Bands was held. When written up, the minutes from that meeting need not be approved.

### III. Privilege Of The Floor

Melissa Schreiner once again mentioned the Teen Acting Workshops which the New Berlin Public Library is featuring this summer. Those interested should contact her, not Mary Berg.

The possibility of the Youth Advisory Board organizing a Relay For Life team was brought up. The Milwaukee Relay For Life will be on June 27, 2003. Elmbrook's and Franklin's Relays will be on July 11, 2003. Eric Schmidt, a former member of the Board (soon to be reappointed), discussed his interest in organizing the team and being its Captain. Katie Chiovero, Mason Fong, Teddy Walsh, Jack Niles, and David McLaughlin indicated interest as well. Officer Pine will email Schmidt further information as soon as possible.

#### **IV. Battle of the Bands Committee**

##### **A. Report From May 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting**

1. "Flashpoint," "Far Side," "Jabberwocky," and "3 Blocks To Murdock" will most likely play at the event. The Board must exercise scrutiny to make sure no band with questionable content is allowed to play. Past experiences rule certain bands out.

2. First prize will be all money collected from bands' entry fees. (\$10 per band). Second and third prize still need to be determined. The judging panel should include teenagers. In addition, someone must time each band.
3. Everyone should distribute flyers! Bybee will try to contact Karen Nork from Channel 25, the New Berlin Citizen, and other newspapers.
4. Kate Bonner is looking into T-shirts which Board members could wear at the event. Twenty-two green shirts need to be ordered, with the letters "YAB" on them. The font and size of the letters still must be decided. Ideally, each T-shirt should not cost more than \$6.00.
5. Board volunteers must help set-up the event; BadgerSound will provide sound and equipment. *All* on the Board need to be on the clean-up crew afterwards.

#### **V. Teen Interest Survey**

Tom Riese implored that the survey not include such "no-brainer" questions as "Would you like a Teen Center?" The survey should be passed out at the Battle of the Bands. Dave McLaughlin volunteered to type up a new draft of the survey. Most likely, distribution of this survey will be a top priority *next* school year, where English teachers could require their students to fill it out.

Mike Moths motioned that the meeting be adjourned at 7:24 PM. Kristin Czubkowski seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved. The next official meeting will be at City Hall on July 15, 2003.
