

# Minutes

## NEW BERLIN SAFETY COMMISSION

March 14, 2001 7:30 p.m.

**Meeting called to order:** Called to order at 7:35 p.m. by Chairman Polczynski

**Approval of Minutes:** Motion by Ken Czyzewski to approve the February 21, 2001 minutes. Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously.

### Old Business:

03 00 08 Forest Point Blvd. & Hunter Ln. – Request for stop signs. The Commission does not feel that there is a safety hazard at this time. There is good visibility and the intersection conforms to good, sound traffic engineering principles. **Motion** by Jim Polczynski to deny this request and drop this item from the agenda. Seconded by Bill Dunn and carried unanimously.

01 01 02 Cold Spring Rd., 124<sup>th</sup> St. to Sunny Slope Rd. – Request to lower speed limit from 35 mph to 25 mph. Traffic surveys done by the City Engineering Dept. and the Police Dept. indicate the average speed to be 35 mph. There does not appear to be an accident problem on this stretch of roadway. Due to the narrow shoulders and roughness of the roadway, however, the Engineering Dept. may look at improvement to this road in the future. **Motion** by Bill Dunn to deny this request and drop this item from the agenda. Seconded by Jim Polczynski and carried unanimously.

02 01 02 Possible ordinance for school buses to use their flashing red lights on a divided highway. The reconstruction of Greenfield Ave. will prevent school buses from using their signals without an ordinance allowing them to do so. Ted Wysocki reported that this item had been denied at the March 13, 2001 Council meeting.

Commission members discussed this further. **Motion by Bill Dunn to recommend to Council that such an ordinance be reconsidered with input from the New Berlin bus company.**

### Tabled Items:

03 00 06 Keep Kid Alive – Drive 25 (Revisited). (Tabled 10/11/00)

The Commission was given an update by Community Services Officer Dan Hanlon. Many volunteers have come forward and Dan expects to set the program into motion this spring.

### New Business:

01 01 03 Elm Grove Rd. and Greenfield Ave. - Request for "No Parking" signs on Elm Grove Rd., south of Greenfield Ave. It seems that since curbs have been added here the lane of travel is partially blocked when a vehicle parks on Elm Grove Rd. Hold this item on the agenda for Commissioners to study further.

02 01 03 Lincoln Ave. & 162<sup>nd</sup> St. - Request for cautionary signs on north and southbound 162nd St. that indicate cross-traffic on Lincoln Ave. does not stop. Hold this item on the agenda for Commissioners to study further.

03 01 03 Request for an ordinance authorizing "No Parking" signs by fire station bays and driveways. It appears that State Statute 346.55 covers this request, but the Commission will confer with City Attorney Reilly for possible further recommendation. Hold this item on the agenda.

04 01 03 Camrose Ave. and Maple Ridge Rd. - Request for "Stop" signs. Hold this item on the agenda for further study.

Motion by Jim Polczynski to adjourn the meeting at 8:50 a.m. Seconded by Kory Hauser and carried unanimously.
