The objective of the New Berlin Police Department Citizens' Academy program is to form an understanding by the citizens of the City of New Berlin of the mission, values, and operations of the Police Department. To this end the Citizens' Police Academy was created to allow the citizens of the City of New Berlin to experience firsthand the day-to-day operations of the department as it serves the community and its residents.

This academy will offer participants an eleven-week program, which will provide them with an overview of the operations of the department, and some hands-on experience into the nature of police services offered to the community.

The eleven-week program will include classroom training, open discussion, multi-media presentations, demonstrations, hands-on practical applications, and will include at least one patrol shift in which the participant will have an opportunity to ride along with a police officer to experience patrol operations first hand.

Upon completion of the program, the participants will be able to demonstrate an understanding of the values, goals, objectives, and operations of the police department that serves the community in which they reside and/or work. Students will be awarded certificates of attendance at a graduation dinner held at the conclusion of the academy.

It is the hope of the New Berlin Police Department that the citizens who graduate from the Citizens' Police Academy will be in a position to better help the department in community relations by being able to express a detailed understanding of the department's role in the community.
